To Whom It May Concern:

The Superfund Branch of the Kentucky Division of Waste Management (KDWM) previously received a submission concerning reported contamination on your property at 4612 Schuff Avenue, in Louisville, Kentucky. The information that was submitted concerning the contamination on the subject property indicated that there might have been a release of petroleum products to the soil and/or groundwater from off site sources. All releases whether they are reportable or not must be remediated in accordance with KRS 224.01-400 and KRS 224.01-405. Additionally, the statute (KRS 224.01-405) provides that "In the event of a release to the environment of petroleum or a petroleum product from a source other than a petroleum storage tank, any person who owns or operates the source from which the release occurred or any person who caused the release shall characterize the extent of the release as necessary to determine the effect of the release on the environment and shall perform corrective action."

Based on the requirements of the statute, prior analytical data, and the newly executed deed of purchase presented for review, it does not appear that Wolf Properties LLC (dba) as Wolf Printables, is responsible for the PAH contamination found during a 2008 environmental assessment at 4612 Schuff Avenue, in Louisville, Kentucky. The documented PAH contamination may be coming from an offsite source. Furthermore, at my direction 2 VOC (Volatile Organic Compound) sample points were collected. All analyzed VOC's were at levels below the Region 9 Residential PRG's (Preliminary Remediation Goals).

This determination extends only to known effects of the contamination identified above, and the requirements set forth by the Division. Further action may be required if additional effects of the contamination are discovered at a later date or if other releases are reported to the Cabinet.
