Situated just 10 miles from the airport and the state capital of Columbus, Westerville is also within 500 miles of more than half the United States and Canadian population. A rich heritage, Westerville was world headquarters to the Prohibition movement in the early 1900s. In 1916, Westerville became one of the first communities in Ohio to adopt the Council-Manager form of government.
