Hendrix College is a private undergraduate liberal arts college in Conway, Arkansas, a suburban city of 58,900 that is 30 minutes from Little Rock, the capital city of Arkansas with a metropolitan population of 699,700.

Hendrix was founded in 1876 and has been affiliated with the United Methodist Church since 1884. The 175-acre Hendrix campus includes academic, residential and recreational resources as well as the Village at Hendrix, a new urbanism community adjacent to campus.

#### **RESIDENCE OPTIONS**

More than 90% of students live in co-ed and single sex college-owned housing, including six traditional residence halls, five residence houses, three theme houses, and five apartment complexes.



### ENGAGED LEARNING

Hendrix College is a national model for engaged learning in higher education.
