PROPERTY OVERVIEW

Rare waterfront site available with frontage on the Choctawhatchee Bay. The 1.1+/- acre parcel is zoned MU-Mixed Use and can accommodate several commercial and residential uses. All utilities have been brought to the site and the site can accommodate up to a +/- 6,500 SF building. The site is located just before the Shalimar bridge and is contiguous to the newly built TownePlace Suites hotel which has 112 rooms. The property is located on the high trafficked Eglin Pkwy which is the main thoroughfare in Ft Walton Beach. Eglin Pkwy experiences in excess of 47,000 vehicles per day. The site is ideally located in the main retail corridor with excellent visibility from the road and near shopping, restaurants, and several national big box retailers. This is a highly desirable restaurant or retail location with frontage on the bay and is located within minutes to Eglin Air Force Base, beautiful beaches, shopping, and entertainment. The trade area has a very stable employment which is characterized by military personnel from Eglin Air Force Base and Hurlburt Field. Within 5 miles of the property there are an estimated 71,500 residents.

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




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FORT WALTON BEACH AERIAL MAP





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THE FORT WALTON BEACH-CRESTVIEW-DESTIN METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREA OVERVIEW

The Fort Walton Beach-Crestview-Destin Metropolitan Statistical Area (the "Fort Walton Beach MSA") is comprised entirely of Okaloosa County and encompasses an area of approximately 1,082 square miles in northwest Florida that extends from the Gulf of Mexico in the south to the Alabama state line to the north. The area has been voted "Ten Best Places to Live" by Money Magazine and is best known for its large military presence, very stable employment base and tourist industry made possible by Florida's best beaches.

The Crestview-Ft Walton Beach-Destin Metropolitan Statistical Area's (MSA) May 2018 unemployment rate of 2.7% is the lowest it has been in over 10+ years.

The Fort Walton Beach MSA offers an assortment of unspoiled landscape from rich farm land and pine forests to the famous sugar-white beaches of the Emerald Coast - a name earned for its pristine and clear beaches that attract visitors from the entire Southeast region of the United States.

With an estimated 4.5 million people visiting the Emerald Coast annually, Okaloosa enjoys its stable year-round consumer activity. Every dollar spent in the MSA from tourism goes through the local economy 1.8 times.

The Fort Walton MSA has been voted as Ten Best Places to Live by Money Magazine by virtue of the area's year-round favorable climate, its assortment of award-winning hospitals, cultural activities, renowned beaches, stable employment base and good educational system. The area is served by five major hospitals, including among others Fort Walton Beach Medical Center,

The Fort Walton Beach MSA has a secondary school system ranked among the best in the nation, a major university and a community college. Residents and tourists visiting the Fort Walton Beach MSA also enjoy a number of museums, art galleries, a science center and historical sites. The Mattie Kelly Arts Center has two fine art galleries, a theater-in-the-round, a 3,500 capacity amphitheater, a music wing and a 1,650 seat main theater that is home to the Northwest Florida Symphony Orchestra. The Fort Walton Beach MSA offers year-round golfing options, including six private clubs, twelve semi-private courses and over one dozen public courses.


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PLAT & LOCATION MAPS



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
